Mayor Leroy Hughes called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

5. Swearing in of Chief Sowell and Officer Pruitt

Municipal Judge Jeff Cox administered the oath of office to Chief of Police Jonathan Sowell. Judge Cox then administered the oath of office to officer Timothy Pruitt.

7. Approval of Minutes of Previous Meeting(s)

8. Chief Jonathan Sowell - Update on Police Department Activity

Chief Sowell gave the update on the police department's activity for the month of September, 2023. Activity included: 17 reports filed, 2 felony arrests, 3 occasions of assisting other agencies, 134 calls for service answered, 3 auto accident reports filed, 7 citations written, and 29 warnings issued.

9. Judge Jeff Cox – Update on Municipal Court Activity

Judge Cox reported the Municipal Court Activity for month of September, 2023. There were 8 citations received, with fines and court costs collected totaling \$375.00. Remitted to state – \$76.00, City retention – \$299.00.

10. Liz Jones - Update on Main Street Program

Liz Jones reported that the annual Imagine the Possibilities Tour on October 13 went well. Attendees were taken on a tour throughout the downtown district and shown different builds for lease or sale. There was some interest in the Imagene's Café building and the old Pinto Pony Bakery building.

Regarding the Smithsonian: Museum on Main Street Project, planning meetings have been held with Texas Historical Commission staff and local main partners. An informational booth will be set up at the Sassafras Festival on October 28 to help spread the word and garner more interest.

Upcoming events include Christmas Market Days on December 1 and 2, as well as the Christmas Parade on December 1 a 6:00 p.m.

11. Update from City Manager Jeaneyse Mosby

City Manager Jeaneyse Mosby reported that she had received a proposal to put the PUC fine money back into the City's electrical system and had in turn submitted that proposal to the PUC's lawyer. This proposal includes \$350 put toward funding a contract to provide notification for any future related deadlines, and the rest will go toward improving the City's electrical system.

Contractors working on replacing old poles and copper lines were moved to Ironosa Rd to get that line back up.

Repairs and cosmetic improvements are being made to the old cotton gin. The old caboose is to be repainted as well.

A digital timer has been purchased and will be used for Citizen Presentations once it is mounted.
